October Challenge

The month of October is the face of many causes: Cancer Awareness, Red Ribbon Week, Down Syndrome Awareness & many others. One that we find particularly relevant to the work of Club Code is National Bullying Prevention.

For this month's challenge your club will create a 45 second story on Scratch. The story should be about what students should do when they witness bullying happening on their campus. Your project should have at least two sprites (one of those should be your school mascot) and at least one homemade backdrop.

The two sprites should interact with each other and by the end of the story there should be a clear message about bullying. Once you are done, submit your URL under the October challenge discussion.

Each school and each grade will be allowed to submit 2 entries. This means that each school can have up to 4 projects submitted (2 for 4th and 2 for 5th). Some clubs have a large number of students and because of that, we recommend that students work on this project in groups of 3.

Just as an example, if a club has 15 students you would split them into 5 groups. Each group would create a project, but only two will be submitted. The selection of the two entries is up to your discretion (clubs can vote on them, etc.).

Remember that these are the basic requirements and NOBODY likes to be basic. Be creative, but above all, HAVE FUN.

Other things to remember:

- This project should be completed solely by students in Club Code UTRGV.
- The project should be completed and submitted on Friday, November 4.
- Creativity will be very important on this challenge.
